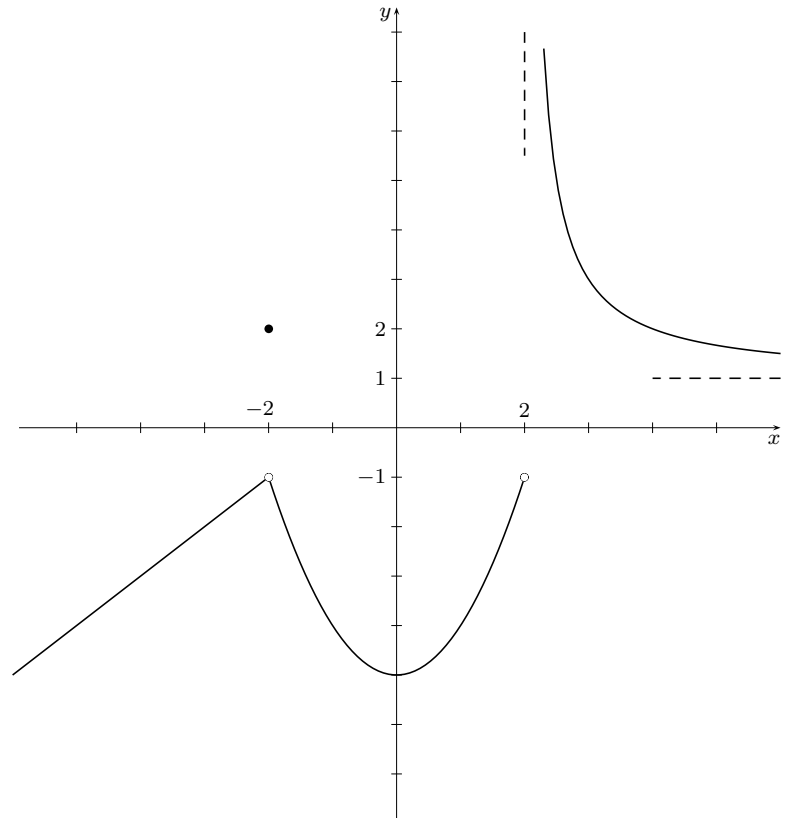

(4) 3. Find the point(s) of discontinuity of the function. Justify using the definition of continuity.

$$f(x) = \begin{cases} \frac{1}{(x+5)(x+1)} & \text{if } x < -2 \\ \frac{x+1}{5} & \text{if } x \geq -2 \end{cases}$$

$$f(x) = \begin{cases} 3x - 4k & \text{if } x \geq 5 \\ 2x + 9 & \text{if } x < 5 \end{cases}$$

- (6) 5. (a) Use the limit definition of the derivative of a function to find $f'(x)$ for $f(x) = \frac{3}{2x + 5}$.

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- (5) 14. There are 50 apple trees in an orchard. Each tree produces 800 apples. For each additional tree planted in the orchard, the output per tree drops by 10 apples. How many trees should be added to the existing orchard in order to maximize the total output of the trees?
(Be sure to use a test to confirm that it is a maximum.)
- (5) 15. The demand function for a DVD Player is $p = -0.0005x + 110$ where p is the price per unit and x is the number of units.
- Determine the marginal revenue if $x = 80000$. Explain what it means.
 - If the cost function is given by $C(x) = 5000 + 40x$, determine the profit function.
 - How many units x should be produced to maximize the profit?
- (5) 16. The demand function for a certain product is given by $p = 36 - 2\sqrt{x}$, $0 \leq x \leq 324$ where p is the price per unit and x is the number of units produced.
- Find the price elasticity of demand η , if 100 units are produced.
 - If 100 units are produced, is the demand elastic or inelastic? Justify your answer.
 - Determine the production level x so that the demand will have unit elasticity.
